For the 2023-2024 academic year, the Franz Rosenzweig Minerva Research Center invites applications for doctoral and post-doctoral fellowships devoted to research on “The German-Jewish Quotidian.” Our aim is to bring together scholars from a variety of disciplines, including history, philosophy, literature, and cultural studies, whose different perspectives on the study of German-Jewish everyday life, ordinary language, and popular culture will engender fruitful research and scholarly discussion.

Successful applicants will be granted a monthly stipend of 6,000 NIS for post-doctoral fellowships or 5,500 NIS for doctoral fellowships. Fellows from abroad will also be allotted a round-trip flight (up to \$800 or €600). Fellows are expected to carry out their research at the Franz Rosenzweig Minerva Center at The Hebrew University of Jerusalem from October 2023 through June 2024, and to contribute to the Center's projects and activities.

Applicants must have the ability to read texts and to follow lectures given in German.
